Class Description <ul style="list-style-type: none">• There are 6 students (5 from China, 1 from Japan) in this advanced oral communication class.• Students have level-four vocabulary and grammar knowledge so that they are ready to improve oral communication skills.		
Terminal Objective <i>Students will be able to...</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Conclude their time spent working with their student teachers through wrap-up activities		
Enabling Objectives <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Get help on final assignments if needed• Share what has been enjoyable or helpful about the class• Write positive comments to fellow students• Conclude the class with a fun game		
Materials & Equipment <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Big Blue Button• Microphone and webcam• PowerPoint/PDF presentation		
Procedures/Activity	What is the TEACHER doing?	What are the STUDENTS doing?
Introduction	Greet the class and present them with a class outline and the class objectives	Listen and ask questions as needed.

Help with final assignments	Ask the students if they have any questions about or are having difficulty with any of their final assignments. Provide any possible help if needed.	Ask the teachers for help with assignments, if needed
Closure activity 1: class takeaways	Ask the students to share what they have enjoyed, will miss, or will take away from the class. Ask the students to turn on their microphone and share. The teachers can participate as well.	Unmute microphones and share what they have enjoyed, will miss, or will take away from the class.
Closure activity 2: What's next	Ask the students to share what their plans are for their futures. The teachers can participate as well.	Unmute microphones and share their plans.
Closure activity 3: positive messages	Write each student's and each teacher's name in the shared notes. Ask the students to write positive messages about their classmates and, if they wish, their teachers, under their names. Remind the students that shared notes are anonymous.	Write comments in the shared notes.
